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>> Councilmember Chirco: I'd like to call the Rules and Open Government committee to order. Are there any changes to the agenda. Okay. The first item is the council agenda for March 9th. Page 1? And it does show we are starting at 9:00. Just because it's so much fun! Page 2 and 3. Page 4 and 5? I have a note on 3.3. That's a recommended to drop per City Clerk.

>> Lee Price: That's correct. This item is no longer time sensitive. We thought at one time it was time sensitive due to the redistricting piece. However, if the council will take this up later this year, we're proposing that we do that, and put it on the November ballot, if that's the council's direction.

>> Councilmember Chirco: Okay.

>> Lee Price: We've already made note on the Website that this item is recommended to be dropped.

>> Councilmember Chirco: Okay, then 3.4, that will be out before Monday?

>> That will be out on Monday.

>> Councilmember Chirco: Oh, on Monday.

>> There's a meeting with the card rooms set for Friday and so we would want that the memo would go out on Monday.

>> Councilmember Chirco: Okay, good.

>> We were talking if this item needed a sunshine waiver. I think we already did that last week at Rules.

>> City Attorney Doyle: We did do it last week at Rules. Like I said at the beginning, this committee doesn't have the ability to take action or authority. Only hear things can't do anything with them.

>> Councilmember Chirco: Good thing we did it last week. Page 6 and 7?

>> Yes, Madam Chair, on page 6 we are requesting deferral of 9.1, the economic development incentives. The report will be out in the packet for the 16th. March 16th.

>> Councilmember Chirco: Okay.

>> And then on page 7 we're also recommending deferral of the monument policy to March 23rd. I believe staff is work on a supplemental.

>> Ed Shikada: Right, that would respond to suggestions made at the committee, CED committee.

>> Councilmember Chirco: And we do have one add for March 9th, that is an excused absence request. And I don't think we need any time-certains, looks timely all by itself. So with that, I think we can approve it to pass it on.

>> City Attorney Doyle: Forward to the city council.

>> Councilmember Chirco: Forward to the city council. Would you --

>> Councilmember Constant: I'll move if you'll second.

>> Councilmember Chirco: I'll second and we'll move it on to the council. And the council agenda for the 16th. Page 1. Page 2 and 3. Sign code ordinance is back. Acquiring a life of its own. Page 4 and 5. Page 6. And there are no additional items.

>> Councilmember Constant: (inaudible).

>> City Attorney Doyle: No, the reason next week is because we have probably a long labor and IPA will take some time, at well.

>> Councilmember Chirco: Okay. You want to move to pass it on to council?

>> Councilmember Constant: I'll make the motion. I won't be there that day so it's easy. If you want to add a few things go ahead.

>> Councilmember Chirco: I'll drop a few before you get back. All right, we will move this on to council. RDA.

>> Madam Chair, the redevelopment agency has already cancelled the March 9th agenda, that's on -- the agency agenda listed an on March 16th, we also have no items and with your concurrence would recommend we go ahead and publish a cancellation for the March 16th afternoon session for the agency. If there is any closed session items or joint items on the council agenda for the agency we would still be there for those.

>> Councilmember Chirco: Looks like they were both deferred. Okay, thank you. Next item is on public record.

>> Councilmember Constant: I have one comment. Just in relation to item D. I just realize that I don't know if other people knew it before me. But we have two major city events from the same department happening at the same time. One is the greatly American litter cleanup which all ten council offices are very actively engaged in at the same time at the opening of happy hollow park. I'm not sure how that happened, but they're both out of PRNS, I think that should be noted that that's going to make it very difficult for a lot of councilmembers and a lot of the general public. Because that's a really widely attended event throughout the city.

>> Councilmember Chirco: I really have to agree with councilman scant. I would hope that's one of the reasons they published the city calendar. Is there anything else?

>> Councilmember Constant: Nope.

>> Councilmember Chirco: Can we note and file this Mr. City Attorney?

>> Councilmember Constant: Note it.

>> City Attorney Doyle: Yeah, just note it.

>> Councilmember Constant: That's way said.

>> Councilmember Chirco: All righty. And then the City Clerk mentioned that the donation of the surplus fire vehicles, they're requesting that it be kicked for one week to 3/16.

>> 3-10.

>> Councilmember Chirco: 3-10, I wrote the wrong date down.

>> Councilmember Constant: On that do we just add it to that agenda now?

>> Lee Price: No, we'll juts defer it to next week always Rules agenda. Then the full committee can review and consider it.

>> Councilmember Chirco: And with that --

>> Councilmember Constant: A new record.

>> Councilmember Chirco: I figured we could you know do it on our way in and that would be done when we got here.

>> Councilmember Constant: Hopefully David doesn't take us overtime.

>> Councilmember Chirco: Mr. wall you would like to address the Rules committee. Welcome, you have two minutes.

>> Councilmember Constant: Or one and a half. Just kidding.

>> I've always said councilmember can do no wrong. Nobody ever takes me seriously.

>> Councilmember Constant: I do, I do.

>> David Wall: In any case, sustainable agriculture was heralded yesterday, for some unknown reason. I was taken aghast and would have fallen down had I not been sitting down. This is outstanding. The more sustainable agriculture you have, that means people will be growing their own food, fellowship and more with their neighbors, doing a whole bunch of other innovative things. But above all they will have more money to spend on other things, whatever those things maybe. This gets to the issue of public parks. Current landscaping in my opinion should change. There should be all sorts of fruit trees in city parks. Lemon trees, orange trees, virtually go without maintenance. Other fruit trees require some maintenance. And this will require a virtual city docent program for a variety of functions. One of which will be taking care of parks, in this particular incidence. Also raising food and herbs. So I want to tell you about that. And I want to thank you for putting up with everything that citizens throw at you. I really do. And get out today in between the storms and have some fun. Thank you.

>> Councilmember Chirco: Thank you, Mr. Wall. Meeting adjourned.
